21. (5pts) A convicted murder has donated a kidney to his daughter who is a drug addict and has severe diabetes. Now she needs another kidney. The convicted murderer in serving a sentence of 99 years and is now 60 years old with 60 years to serve. He insists he has the right to give his other kidney to his daughter, but the state medical board says no as the state has a duty to keep prisoners alive and this would require dialysis for the rest of the life of the prisoner---a very costly medical procedure. The prisoner argues that he could get a cadaver or some other kidney which was a match for him in the future and that the only chance for his daughter is to have his kidney according to the immunology of his daughter. The medical board agrees with the assertions but cannot make the commitment of the resources and has grave concerns that allowing this to happen will be a guarantee of providing a kidney to the criminal which might be life saving to someone who is not a criminal. You are the chairman of the state's ethics committee and are asked to make a determination regarding the handling of this situation.
