end
```

 - (b) inputs: age func. name: ageCalc outputs: a, g, e

3. For single precision floating point numbers, how many bits are allocated to the sign, exponent and fraction values, respectively ?

6. What is the worst case computation time (WCCT) of the following program?

```
for i = 1:n
    for j = 1:n
        for k = 1:n

        end
    end
end
```

```
1 global a
2 a = 5;
3 seed = 10;
4 result = encoder(seed)
5 function y = encoder(x)
6 y = x + a;
7 end
```

However, when you run this program, you receive the following error messages:

```
Unrecognized function or variable 'a'.
Error in myTester>encoder (line 6)
y = x + a
Error in myTester (line 4)
result = encoder(seed)
```

```

    ratio = array(m)/array(m-1);
end
```

If `input` is an integer such that $input > 1$, what is the closed form expression of the output `ratio` of `myRatio(input)` ?

        index = middle;
    elseif array(middle) < val
        index = middle + binarySearch(array(middle+1:length(array)), val);
    else
        index = binarySearch(array(1:middle-1), val);
    end
end
```

What is the worst case computation time for `binarySearch` where n is the length of the array?

```

13. Consider the following excerpt from the ASCII table:

```
Dec Char  
-----  
69 E  
70 F  
71 G  
72 H  
73 I  
74 J  
75 K  
76 L  
77 M  
78 N  
79 O
```

What is the output of the following code?

```
array = [72 69 76 76 79];  
char(array)
```

- (a) ans = 'HELLO'

I save the two functions in the same folder and then call $g(1)$ in the command window. Why do I receive an error?

```

    {'World' } {3x2 cell  }           999
```

If I type `{C1, C2}` into my command window, what will the size and class of the output be?

20. The following recursive function `Aurebesh` parses a given sentence. Suppose `Ummm` is another function used to break sentences into the first word and rest of the sentence.

For example, 'What does this do' is parsed into `word = 'What'` and `rest = 'does this do'`. For the following program, what is the first word displayed to the screen?

```
sentence = 'What does this do'
function output = Aurebesh(sentence)
    [word,rest] = Ummm(sentence);
    if isempty (rest) == 0
        output = Aurebesh(rest);
    else
        output = word;
    end
    disp(word)
end
```

- (a) What
 - (b) does
 - (c) this
 - (d) do
 - (e) Nothing will be displayed
21. You are given the following recursive function:

```
function output = bottom_up_recursion(n)
    if n == 49
        output = 0;
    else
        output = n + bottom_up_recursion(n+1);
    end
end
```

Which function call will return the following error message:

Out of memory. The likely cause is an infinite recursion within the program.
